### "Where's a Forest of Arden when you need one?"

Our production of Shaina Taub and Laurie Woolery's heartfelt adaptation of Shakespeare's classic comedy, As You Like It, was chosen for this season at Pitt Stages for many reasons. These ranged from access to heightened text, exploring challenging design prospects, and honoring the growing interest in musical theatre performance in the department, among others. From my perspective as the director, the most compelling reason was the focus this play places on community and healing. New York Times theatre critic Alexis Soloski began their review of the original 2017 production with a line from the play, "All are welcome here." As you will read in the well-crafted note from our Pitt student dramaturgs (Dugan & Smith), the original production of this musical was created for, by, and with members of the community to respond, illuminate, and offer a place of healing for all involved and all who came to see. The creators of this production sought to include as many individuals from as many different communities as possible in the show: thereby expanding the circle of the "theatre makers" and "theatre goers" beyond the reach of New York's Public Theater to push the boundaries and potential of the form. This updated version of a staple of dramatic literature offers, "a utopian vision of a society that favors acceptance over division, honesty over obfuscation, grace over meanness." It is our great hope that our production is no different.

The process of creating *As You Like It* at Pitt was overwhelmingly collaborative and could not have happened without each and every name you will read in this program. We shifted from design conversations about Shakespeare's pastoral landscapes to the power of street art in our own city's Strip District; we chose to look at the wrestling scene through a lens of a fandom that is uniquely Pittsburgh; we worked hard to include as many voices as possible in the story you will see today. The musical's opening song, "All the World's a Stage," pulled from the most iconic line of this play, is an invitation to recognize the magic the theatre can have to transport us somewhere, to experience the adventures of the characters we find there, and to invite us to an empathy in ourselves that may have not been reachable otherwise.

On behalf of the cast, crew, creative team, designers, faculty, staff, and students who made this production possible, we invite you to our Forest of Arden for a brief moment, to our brand of magic made of Shakespeare's words, Taub's music, and the countless generous choices made by all involved here at Pitt. We offer this story, this Arden, as a place to escape, to fall in love, and to heal- if only for a short time out of your day. So, without further adieu, "To Arden!"

# Dramaturgy Note



William Shakespeare is one of the most well known playwrights of all time. His famous words, "All the world's a stage," were first written in his play As You Like It, a pastoral comedy that manages to discuss the calm and restorative life away from the royal court in a comedic and light-hearted manner. Since the first American performances of Shakespeare's plays in the 1730s and 1740s, As You Like It has been a mainstay in American stages and schools.

Shaina Taub turns the five act play into a ninety minute musical, mixing music styles and tones to reach as many people as possible. Whether you're a fan of country, Latin, pop, or several other represented genres, you'll find something to like in Taub's all-encompassing score. Taub also puts an emphasis on simplifying the language. While it's fortunate we don't live in 1590s London, Shakespeare's close attention to poetic structure and use of archaic language makes the dialogue of his plays far less approachable in our modern day. Taub, in the spirit of community, has toned down the dense, Shakespearean language in the music to modern speech while still keeping faithful to the message of the original play. As a compromise, the spoken dialogue comes nearly word-for-word from the original play, just truncated for more streamlined scenes, so the Shakespeare aspect isn't entirely lost.

At its core, As You Like It is a show about community, and finding the good in people. The original show, first performed at The Public Theater in 2017, ran casting on the principle that everyone can perform, no matter their level of theater experience. Pitt Stages' production is keeping this spirit alive by featuring several performing student groups of all kinds from around campus, giving them each a night to perform alongside the cast.

Of course, you can't discuss As You Like It without talking about Arden, an old forest that stood on the West Midlands of England. Arden, the land the principles flee to is central to the theme of community. As Duke Senior sings, "In Arden, we shall answer to adversity with kindness." Arden is a magical forest of refuge that houses anyone in exile who needs a place to live.

Shakespeare grew up right next to the forest of Arden. The magical land of kindness and acceptance that much of the main cast is forced to flee to at the beginning of the show was Shakespeare's childhood backyard. Even if the physical forest of Arden no longer exists, at least at the same capacity as it used to, we all still have a place and community where we feel most at home. The lesson this show teaches us is that kindness and love, in their many forms, conquer all.

This particular adaptation premiered in early autumn, 2017, a famously tumultuous moment for immigration legislation. At the same time an order to have undocumented immigrants crossing the borders tried and held in ICE detainment centers, the Public was commissioning Taub to write this musical. In many ways, Arden can be directly compared to a sanctuary city of our world. As You Like It is a show with themes of love, acceptance, and, most importantly, community at its heart.

# **Playwright Biographies**

#### Shaina Taub

Raised in the green mountains of Vermont, Shaina Taub is a New York-based songwriter and performer. She has the won the Jonathan Larson Grant, the Fred Ebb Award and the Billie Burke Ziegfeld Award and has an ongoing concert residency at Joe's Pub. Taub has starred in her musical adaptations of Shakespeare's Twelfth Night and As You Like It at the Public Theater's Delacorte in Central Park, commissioned for their groundbreaking Public Works initiative. She's currently writing a musical about the American women's suffrage movement and she's writing lyrics for the upcoming musical of The Devil Wears Prada, with music by Sir Elton John. Taub's work was featured in Lincoln Center's American Songbook concert series and she recently made her Carnegie Hall debut performing her music with the New York Pops. She wrote songs for and co-starred in Bill Irwin and David Shiner's Old Hats, directed by Tina Landau at the Signature Theatre and A.C.T. She earned a Lucille Lortel Award nomination as Mary in the off-Broadway run of Natasha, Pierre & The Great Comet of 1812, and appeared in the original cast of Hadestown at New York Theatre Workshop. Her songs have been performed by Audra McDonald and Sutton Foster, and she wrote the theme song for Julie Andrews' Netflix series Julie's Greenroom, performed by Sara Bareilles. #### Laurie Woolery

Laurie Woolery is a director, playwright, educator, facilitator and producer. She has worked at the Public Theater, Oregon Shakespeare Festival, Yale Repertory, Trinity Repertory, Goodman Theater, Cornerstone Theater Company, South Coast Repertory, Mark Taper Forum, Denver Center, Los Angeles Philharmonic, East West Players, Los Angeles Theatre Center, Inge Center for the Arts, Plaza de la Raza/RedCAT, Ricardo Montalban Theatre, Deaf-West Theatre, Highways Performance Space and Sundance Playwrights Lab as well as the Sundance Children's Theater. Woolery has directed world premieres of plays by Tanya Saracho, Mary Kathryn Nagle, Charise Castro Smith, Marisela Trevino Orta, Aditi Kapil, K.J. Sanchez, Julie Marie Myatt, Cody Henderson, Allison Carey and others. Currently, Woolery is the Director of Public Works at The Public Theater. In the summer of 2017, with collaborators Shaina Taub and Sonya Tayeh, Woolery directed a new musical adaptation of As You Like It at the Delacorte Theater with 200 New Yorkers. That production was named as one of "The Best Theater in 2017" by the New York Times. Woolery teaches at Princeton, NYU, Brown, USC, Cal Arts, Citrus College, California State University at Northridge and California State University at Los Angeles. She serves on the Board of the Latinx Producers Action Network, Latinx Commons and is a founding member of The Sol Project in New York. Woolery is a proud recipient of the Fuller Road Fellowship for Women Directors of Color.

# **Director's Biography**

Tom Pacio (Director) is currently a Visiting Assistant Professor of Acting in the University of Pittsburgh Theatre Arts Department as well as the Director of Creative Arts at Vassar College. Prior teaching experience includes New York University, The CAP21 Musical Theatre Conservatory, Vassar College, The Stella Adler School of Acting, Point Park University, and SUNY Dutchess. He has served as both Education Director and Producing Director for Vassar's Powerhouse Theater Program. Directing credits include The Moon in Our Home, On the Town, devised musicals Looking for Someone, and Sympathetic Frequencies; Scapin, and a reading of a new musical adaptation of The Tell Tale Heart. Other professional experience includes working for a bi-coastal talent agency, for several casting directors, and in the offices of the world-renowned Nederlander Organization. 
